Seeds that drop from trees in your community may be collected and bagged by type, then delivered to a local drop-off site. Following [proper collection guidelines](#) will help ensure that the seeds you gather grow successfully into trees. Collect individually or with your family, pack or troop. Due to the overwhelming participation of Boy Scout Troops and Cub Scout Packs in the past, *Growing Native* is developing a booklet that presents how the program's activities provide opportunities for Cub Scouts to work on their forester pin and Boy
