

Looking Ahead to 2006

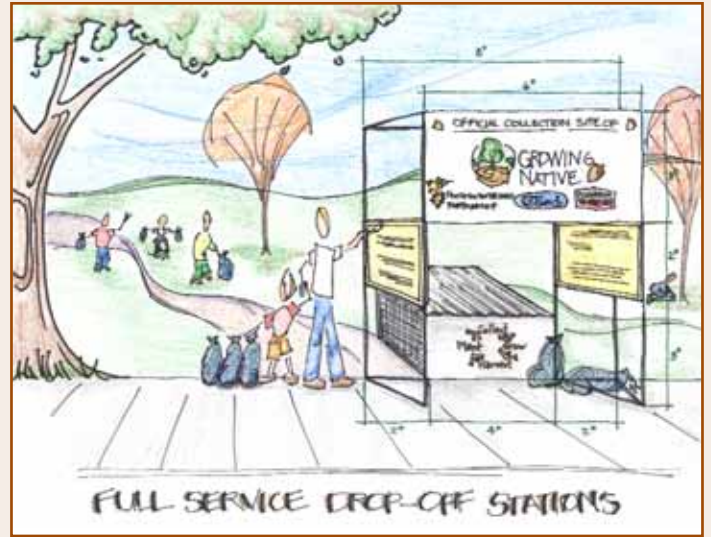
This year, further emphasis will be placed on educating *Growing Native* participants about the importance of streamside forest buffers to water quality. New outreach methods will be established to create a meaningful watershed experience for students.

Education Guide:

A *Growing Native* curriculum specific to the Potomac watershed will be developed to correspond to National Science Standards. Educator workshops will be held to implement this new guide.

Educational Drop-Off Kiosks:

25 kiosks will be established throughout the watershed. Each will include educational information about *Growing Native* and the Potomac watershed, and will include a drop-off bin for collected seeds.

Ambassador Training Program:

Dedicated volunteers will become representatives of *Growing Native* at community events and presentations, and will assist in managing seed drop-off sites.

Badge Program for Scouts:

A program will be designed whereby *Growing Native* activities will contribute toward unique Boy and Girl Scout badges.

Expanded Outreach Materials:

New materials will be developed to aid volunteers in *Growing Native* seed collection procedures and to educate them on how they can help improve the Potomac watershed's water quality.
